~ POLISH TRADITIONS, HOLIDAYS, and HISTORY IN MAY~

In Poland, three holidays at the beginning of May, form a long holiday weekend, known as Majówka. They are: *International Workers' Day* (Święto Pracy) on May 1st., *Polish National Flag Day* (Dzien Flagi) on May 2nd., and *Constitution Day* (Święto Konstytucji Trzeciego Maja) on May 3rd.

LABOR DAY's first celebration in Poland took place on May 1, 1890. In 1950, during the communist dominance in Poland, it become a national holiday. For years it was celebrated by obligatory parades. Today it is mainly used to relax during an extended weekend.

POLISH NATIONAL FLAG DAY is a national holiday in Poland introduced by an act issued on 20 February 2004 and is celebrated on May 2nd. On the same day, the *Day of Polonia and Poles Abroad* is celebrated.

The adoption of the **POLISH CONSTITUTION** by the Sejm of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth on May 3, 1791, is considered to be one of the crucial points in Poland's history and one of the country's major achievements. May 3rd Constitution was the first written national constitution in Europe (and the second oldest in the world after the one in the US). May 3rd become an official holiday in 1919 when Poland gained independence after years of partitioning. The holiday was not celebrated under the communist government. It was re-established as a national holiday after the fall of communism in 1989. Today, celebrations include parades (including an annual military parade) and speeches from national Polish leaders.

This is one of the most famous paintings by Matejko. It depicts King Stanislaus Augustus, together with members of the Grand Sejm and citizens of Warsaw, entering St John's Cathedral to swear in the new national constitution after the Grand Sejm had adopted it in the Royal Castle (visible in the background). Today, *The Constitution of 3 May 1791* painting can be seen in the Royal Castle in Warsaw.

NATIONAL VICTORY DAY - MAY 8th

National Victory Day was proclaimed a national holiday on April 24, 2015. It commemorates the Allied forces' victory over Hitler's Germany. After six years of fighting and an estimated 70-85 million deathes, the war ended with Nazi Germany's unconditional capitulation on 8 May 1945 at 10.30 PM. Military action ceased exactly at 11:01 PM.
